On **12th August 2026**, students of Government College of Education, Burdwan participated in the **Har Ghar Tiranga Campaign** by making the National Flag at their homes.



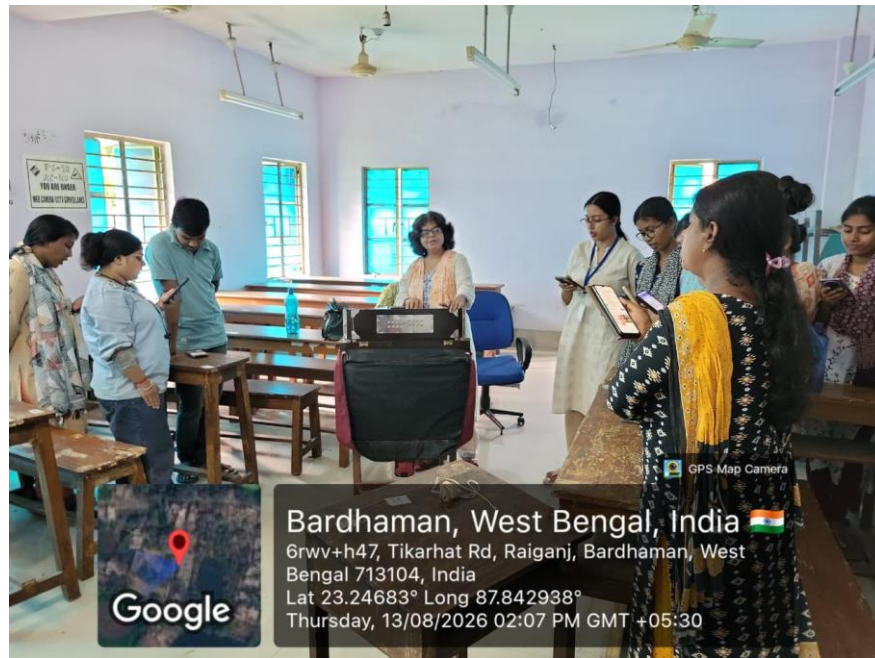
Date: 13/08/2026

Report on the Observance of the Day of Remembrance of the Partition of Bengal and its Tragic Consequences

Date: 14th August, 2026

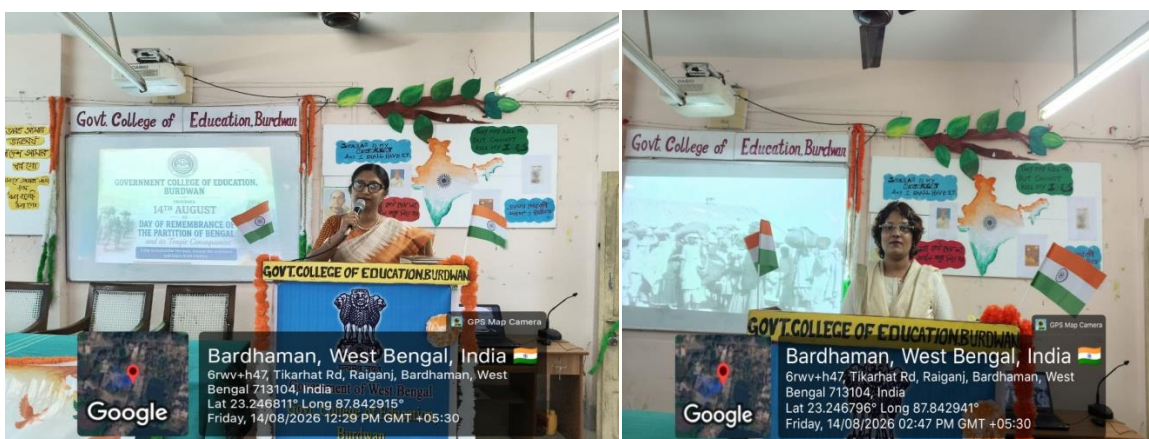
Government College of Education, Burdwan observed 14 August as the “Day of Remembrance of the Partition of Bengal and its Tragic Consequences” in accordance with the communication received from Baba Saheb Ambedkar Education University (BSAEU). The programme was organised with the objective of remembering the suffering, displacement, sacrifices and resilience of the people affected by the Partition of Bengal.

The programme commenced with a Welcome Address, followed by an address by the Principal, Dr. Sreetanuka Nath, on the theme “Remembrance of the Partition of Bengal and its Tragic Consequences.”

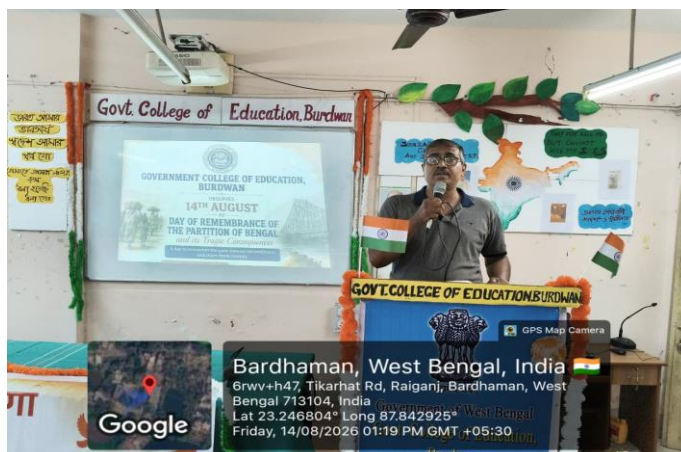




The programme was anchored by Dr. Sudakshina Kar. A brief historical documentary on the Partition of Bengal was presented by Dr. Ranjini Ghosh.



This was followed by the speeches by the staff and students, including Sri Sujit Chattopadhyay (Librarian) and the students Indra Sikdar and Naren Mondal.





A reading session of literary excerpts, poems and memoirs reflecting the experiences of Partition was conducted by Dr. Pratap Kabiraj, Damini Sarkar and Karabi Adak.

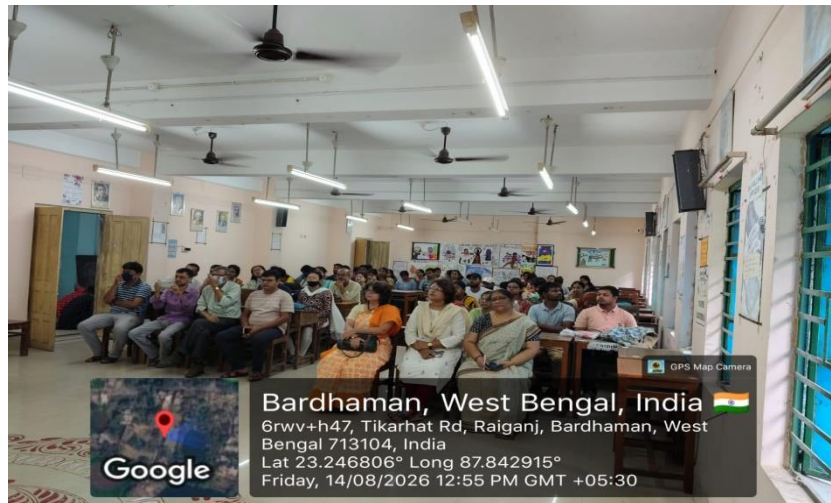

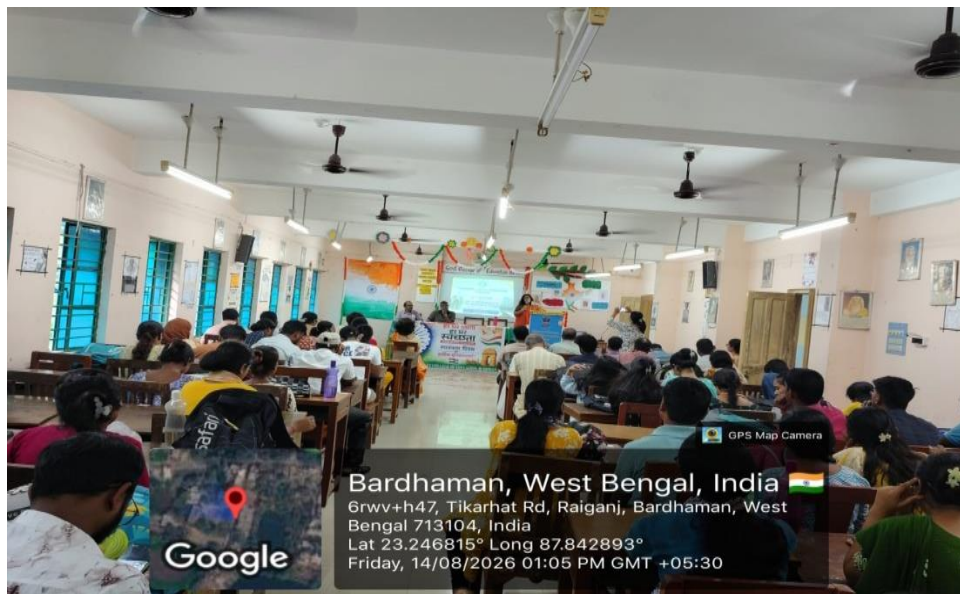

The programme was celebrated with a renewed commitment to uphold the values of patriotism, freedom, national unity and the ideals of Sri Aurobindo.



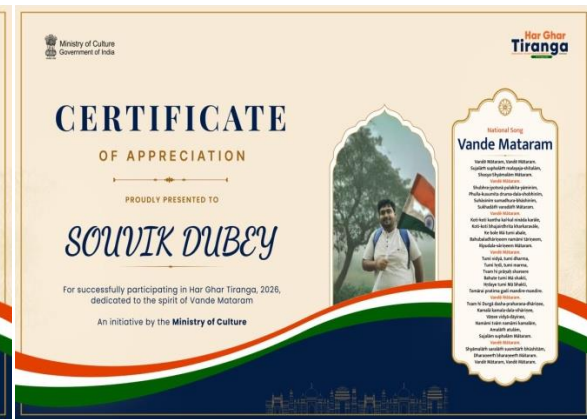
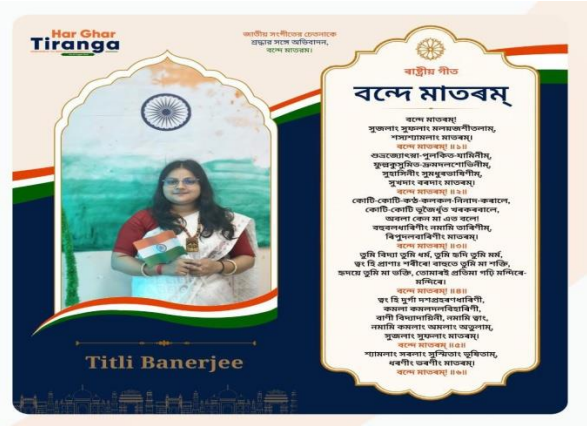

Teachers certified in Har Ghar Tiranga initiative

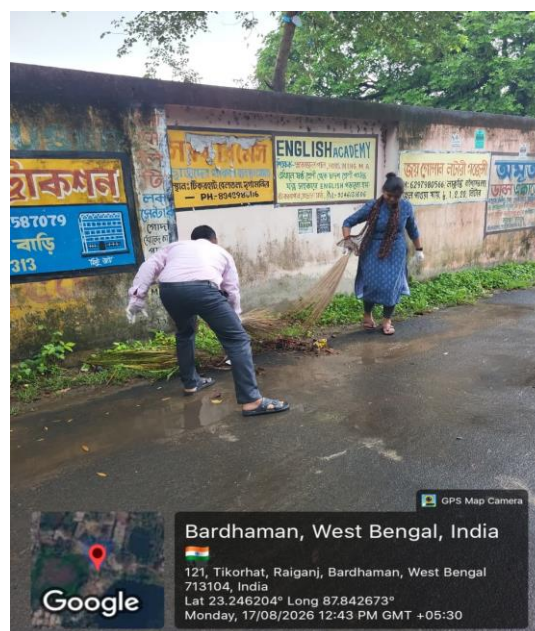
