The competition was structured across three streams, drawing an overwhelming 95% participation rate from the first-semester batch:


Literary Events (Day 1: 06.11.2025)

Fine Arts & Craft (Day 3: 09.11.2025)


Creativity took a visual form with Poster Making and freehand sketching.

ANTI-RAGGING AWARENESS WEEK 8TH TO 12TH DECEMBER 2025 A COMMITMENT TO SAFE AND RESPECTFUL LEARNING

The Government College of Education, Burdwan, organised a three-day Anti-Ragging Awareness Programme from 8th December with the objective of fostering a safe, inclusive, and student-friendly academic environment, in strict compliance with UGC guidelines. The programme sought to sensitise B.Ed. trainees, as future educators, to the ethical, social, and legal implications of ragging and to reinforce a policy of zero tolerance towards all forms of such practices.

INAUGURATION AND KEYNOTE ADDRESSING



Code and Conducts were delivered by the Principal

The programme commenced with an inaugural address by the Principal, Dr. Sreetanuka Nath, who emphasised the institution's unwavering commitment to maintaining a ragging-free campus. She highlighted that dignity, mutual respect, and empathy are foundational values that every teacher trainee must internalise and uphold. As a mark of solidarity with victims of ragging, all participants observed a moment of silence.



The inaugural session was followed by a keynote address delivered by Dr. Sudakshina Kar. In her address, she elaborated on the concept and various forms of ragging, its adverse psychological, social, and academic consequences, and how ragging stands in direct contradiction to the ethical standards and professional responsibilities of the teaching profession.

ANTI-RAGGING POSTER COMPETITION

As part of the programme activities, an Anti-Ragging Poster Competition was organised on 8th december . Students actively participated by presenting handmade posters that conveyed strong messages against ragging and promoted values of respect, empathy, and harmony.




STUDENTS' ENGAGEMENT AND ACTIVITIES

The second day (10 December) started with a detailed PowerPoint presentation by Dr Sudakshina Kar explaining the concept of ragging, its causes, forms, effects on the victims and prevention ways. She also emphasized on the importance of an anti ragging squad (ARS) and its formation. It was followed by an oath taking ceremony by all the students and faculty members. The day was wrapped up with the formation of anti ragging squad and a slogan writing competition judged by Sujit Chattopadhyay sir in which Naren Mondal (sem 3)bagged the only prize.



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


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SESSION ON ZERO TOLERANCE AGAINST RAGGING



The third day(12th december) began with an informative PowerPoint presentation by Dr. Goutam Pahari, which provided a comprehensive understanding of the meaning, causes, and types of ragging, its impact on students' mental health and academic life, and the importance of preventive measures. Special emphasis was laid on institutional mechanisms for reporting ragging and the role and responsibilities of the Anti-Ragging Squad (ARS).



It was followed by a short yet impactful skit performed by Naren Mondal, a B.Ed. Semester III student, which poignantly highlighted the grave consequences and deadly repercussions of ragging. Through evocative expressions and a powerful narrative, the performance sensitively portrayed the emotional, psychological, and social scars inflicted by such inhuman practices, leaving the audience deeply moved and reinforcing the message of zero tolerance towards ragging.



The programme concluded with a valedictory address by the principal, Dr. Sreetanuka Nath, who further sensitised students to the legal, social, and psychological dimensions of ragging. She urged them to remain vigilant, empathetic, and law-abiding, and to act as responsible future educators committed to nurturing a safe and supportive academic environment. She aptly remarked, “Ragging does not build character; it breaks spirits. Our goal is to ensure that every student who enters these gates feels empowered, not intimidated.”






